Nominees for the Award must be actively engaged in healthcare. Their leadership contributions include the mentoring of future leaders toward the goal of transforming organizational performance and improving health and healthcare in the U.S. Their focus on executive teams has resulted in quantifiable improvements in organizational performance, community health status, quality, and value of care delivered.

Nominees contribute personal time and energy to improve healthcare talent industry-wide and display commitment, values, and vision that serve as a role model for future generations of leaders. Their leadership approaches are considered best practice and their leadership skills are recognized across the industry. They are often sought out to provide perspective, guidance, and direction to the field. Nominees have a perspective that is respected in the field and is used to shape the industry through national forums, policymaking, and industry-specific strategic groups.
